• For Environova, the Antigonish area was once again our major focus for the early part of the year. In January we completed the Sports Field Study project for the Town and County of Antigonish. This work was completed

under the direction of Recreation coordinators Tricia Cameron of the town and Marlene Melanson of the county. This included the assessment of 22 recreation sites including baseball, soccer fields and ancillary recreational facilities throughout the county and the town of Antigonish.

• In the spring, Environova completed a plan and design concepts for “The Ducks Unlimited” project around the Cornwallis riverbed area in Kentville for Mark Philips the Parks and Recreation director for the Town of Kentville
